## CQ FIELD DAY DE W2GSA

Field Day 2010 was another success for GSARA. We operated for the last time at Fort Monmouth. In light of the hot weather and possible predicted storms, we decided to operate in the MARS building instead of our tents. We did use emergency power and the air conditioner wasn't working in the building so we still experienced the hardships of Field Day.

For antennas, we strung a Carolina Dipole (furnished by Joe, W2KQ) up about 35 feet between a pair of poles and it worked out well for 80 and 160. For 40 meters, a vertical furnished by Jim, K2EI worked out the best. On 20, 15, and 10, we used a 3-element tri-band beam (also furnished by Jim) up about 45 feet on a bucket vehicle (see picture on page 8). This was easy to erect and was effective. We also put up the NEVIS inverted vee but didn't have much luck with it.

Jim's Yaesu was used for the phone transceiver and Frank's Kenwood TS-2000 served very well as the CW transceiver. A coaxial switch selected the appropriate rig for the antennas. Since we were 1A, only one station could be on the air at a time.

We kept a transmitter on the air almost continuously for the 24 hours and made about the same number of contacts as last year. For extra points, we did copy the ARRL Field Day Message, sent a message to Rich, our Section Manager, made 5 QRP contacts using solar power, and had two unlicensed operators (Andy, KA2VXA daughters) make at least one contact each.

.All in all, those who participated had a good time. Be sure to check out the pictures on page 8. Also, we should start thinking about next year when we can't be at Fort Monmouth. Will we be able to do any better or have more fun?

### Secretary's Report

W2XYZ proposed that we should operate as a 2A with GOTA and a VHF/UHF Station. For antennas, it was proposed to use the K2EI loop, a 3 element tri-band beam, end to end Zepps, and a NEVIS antenna.

A spirited discussion took place and the results are as follows: We will operate as 1A with a Gota and VHF/UHF Radios. The Gota Station will operate from W2XYZ Mobile. Antennas will be the loop, 3 Element Beam and a NEVIS antenna. The call sign will be W2GSA.

Proposed the sum of \$ 400 be authorized for expenditure on Field day Activities. If required.

A motion was made by Jeff, N2LXM and seconded by Jim, K2EI to authorize \$400 to be

spent as needed on Field Day activities. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

### New Business

W2DND is moving and donated his equipment to GSARA. Thank you Bill. W2XYZ sold some of the equipment at the JCDXA Hamfest which resulted in the sum of \$113.00 which was turned over to our Treasurer W2KQ. The rest of the equipment will be held until our next White Elephant Sale.

## DAVE BENTON, W2WSE – SK

Dave Benton, W2WSE died peacefully in his sleep on May 19, 2010. He was born on April 2, 1921 in Boston, MA and spent most of his professional career in New York City and Omaha, NE with AT&T and Northwestern Bell. He was a 1940 graduate of Phillips Exeter Academy and a 1947 graduate of Harvard College.

Communications was the defining theme in Dave's life. Nurturing a keen interest in amateur radio in his youth eventually led to a career with AT&T and involvement with the ham radio community throughout his life. He built his own equipment from Heath kits, as well as the family's first TV and stereo system. Dave was a Charter member of the Marconi Chapter 138 of the QCWA and was subsequently a Diamond Jubilee member.

Dave married Jeanne Proctor on April 1, 1944, just before shipping out as a 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant in the 401<sup>st</sup> Heavy Bombardment Group with the 8<sup>th</sup> Air Force in WWII. From July through December in 1944, he flew 35 missions over Germany as a bombardier, receiving the Air Medal with silver cluster, two Bronze Battle Stars and a Presidential Unit Citation.

Dave used amateur radio to communicate with friends all over the world, often through the use of Morse code. He also played boogie-woogie piano and listened to the jazz greats. He volunteered for Omaha civil defense communications and turned his eyes towards the skies as an amateur astronomer.

Dave and Jeanne retired in 1978 to relax by the ocean in Sea Girt, NJ and to spend most winters on the Caribbean island of Montserrat.

He and Jeanne were married for almost 53 years when Jeanne preceded him in death in 1997. Dave will be missed by his three children, Tracy Benton of St. Paul, MN; David Benton of Madison, WI; and Leslie Benton Bjorncrantz of Evanston, IL; two grandchildren; and his brother Peter.

## AL JACKSON, NK2O – SK

Albert Jackson Jr., NK2O died peacefully on Thursday, June 17, 2010, at Monmouth Medical Center, Long Branch at the age of 80. He was born in Athens, Ga. to Margie Ruth Church and raised in Sanford, Fla., as the eldest of seven children. He attended Howard University in Washington, D.C. He married Lieselotte Lena Pempfer from Giessen Germany. They were together for 47 years before she passed away on Sept. 5, 2001. A career soldier, he spent 25 years in the U.S. Army, retiring as a master sergeant in the Signal Corps. During his time in the military, he was stationed in California, Taiwan, and Germany. He also served two tours of duty in Vietnam. He was awarded a Bronze Star. He retired from active duty as an instructor at the Signal School in Fort Monmouth, (1972). Albert then began working for Johnson & Johnson (Weyerhaeuser) in Skillman until he retired. He was an avid bowler and Ham radio operator. He was a member and former president of the Ocean Monmouth Amateur Radio Club (OMARC) and the Neptune Amateur Radio Club.

He is survived by his daughter, Melinge Jackson-Coryell; his son, Leslie Albert Jackson; his grandchildren, Cherise, Barry, and Anthony; his brothers, Anthony and Eugene Church; and his sisters, Evelyn C. Ledford and Connie Smith.

## BOY SCOUTS REVIVE MERIT BADGES

In keeping with Boy Scouts of America's centennial theme -- Celebrating the Adventure, Continuing the Journey -- four retired badges have been brought back for the group's 100th anniversary. The effective date for earning these new merit badges -- Carpentry (1911-1952), Tracking (formerly Stalking, 1911-1952), Pathfinding (1911-1952) and Signaling (formerly Signaler, 1910-1992) -- is April 1, 2010; requirements must be completed no later than December 31, 2010. The contemporary merit badges closely resemble the original designs of their counterparts, but with a gold border, immediately identifying it as a 2010 historic merit

badge. These four historical merit badges may be used toward a Scout's rank advancement.

"The Signaling merit badge is a great way to encourage hams who are already involved in Scouting to mentor this limited-time badge in their Troop and perhaps in other ways, such as camps," said ARRL Rocky Mountain Division Director Brian Milesosky, N5ZGT; Milesosky is the chairman of the ARRL's ad hoc Committee on Scouting. "Hams -- and especially clubs, that have more resources and volunteers -- who are not involved in Scouting at the present time but want to assist a Troop with earning the Signaling merit badge -- should contact their local BSA Council to inquire about Scoutmasters in their area to contact and offer their assistance." ## PHISHING E-MAILS NOT FROM ARRL

We have received several reports from ARRL members with arrl.net e-mail accounts who have recently been contacted via e-mail asking for personal information, such as user names and passwords. Please be assured that these e-mails are fraudulent attempts at phishing and did not originate from ARRL. "This is a very crude attempt at phishing, using an easily determined spoof of the originating/return address," said ARRL Chief Financial Officer Barry Shelley, N1VXY. "There is never a time when we would ask via mass e-mail for user names and passwords of arrl.net users. There is simply no need to ever do so." If you receive an e-mail asking for personal information and it looks like it originated from ARRL, please do not respond, just delete it.

## FCC SEEKS COMMENTS ON 5 MHZ

In May, the FCC released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) -- ET Docket No 10-98 -- proposing to amend the Part 97 rules governing the Amateur Radio Service. Specifically, the Commission looks to modify the rules pertaining to the use of five channels in the 5330.6-5406.4 kHz band (60 meters) to replace one designated channel with one that is less encumbered, to authorize three additional emission designators and to increase the maximum authorized power in this band. On June 15, a summary of the NPRM was published in the Federal Register, which started the clock on the deadline for comments. Comments must be filed on or before July 15, 2010 (30 days after publication in the Federal Register); reply comments must be filed on or before July 30, 2010 (45 days after publication in the Federal Register). Instructions on how to file comments are listed beginning on page 6 of the NPRM.

## HUDSON DIVISION CABINET MEETING

The Hudson Division Cabinet met on Saturday, June 5. Here is a quick summary of the topics discussed.

It was mentioned at the meeting that the Sussex ARC will be having their annual hamfest at the Sussex county fairgrounds on July 11th and that this is always a large and well attended hamfest.

Every month the Hudson Division selects one club newsletter for mention as the best newsletter in the division. .pdf copies of newsletters should be sent to Frank each month at: [N2FF@arrl.org](mailto:N2FF@arrl.org). I asked if he currently receives the newsletters for the FrankFord Radio Club, GSARA, OMARC or the Marconi chapter of the QCWA and he answered NO.

A discussion of available scholarships administered by the ARRL for radio amateurs was brought forward by Frank. He wanted all to be aware that 65 scholarships are available each year and they need to be applied for by amateurs who wish to further their education.

Frank also mentioned that for those clubs who hold hamfests concurrently with VE tests, that the admission to the hamfest must be free for those VE applicants.

Frank mentioned that the FCC has now proposed to change the vanity call sign program for the issuance of calls in the "class A" pool. The FCC wants to limit this pool to strictly American citizens. I totally agree with this proposal and hope that it was brought about by my proposal on this subject at last year's cabinet meeting. Currently the vanity program is open to all and many amateurs worldwide hold USA callsigns in the vanity program. On the surface there is nothing wrong with this, however, 2 letter call signs are a finite resource that many American hams are unable to have in their own country. Meanwhile many non-American hams hold 2 letter vanity call signs and live outside of the USA. This is good proposal and I applaud the FCC for their willingness to address this unfair situation.

The Hudson Division Awards luncheon will be held at 12 noon on November 14th this year at Biagio's restaurant in Paramus, NJ. The guest speaker will be Kay Craigie, the current ARRL president. Three division awards will be given:

Amateur of the year, Grand Ole Ham and Technical achievement. Please see the Hudson Division website for further information and nomination procedures. <http://www.hudson.arrl.org/> Frank also asked that division clubs put an ad in the luncheon program booklet to help support this event.

I spoke with Joyce (KA2ANF) who is the Hudson Division vice director and she told me that the ARRL is currently working towards the 100th anniversary of the league and is attempting to recover many items in storage and in the attic of headquarters. She is also making periodic trips to Newington volunteering time to assist in this project in the historical committee.

The formation of a "PAC" (political action committee) within the ARRL remains a contentious issue with Dave Sumner opposing it in fear that it could jeopardize the ARRL's tax status. Several directors within the league wish to form a PAC to further amateur radio legislation and not endorse any candidate or party. This will be something interesting to watch in the future!

## 2009 ARRL ANNUAL REPORT

The ARRL Annual Report for 2009 -- now available online and in print -- reviews the major events of the year and documents the renewed growth of both the ARRL and the activities of the Amateur Radio Service. In 2009, the ARRL experienced a growth in membership, ending the year with 156,125 members, an increase of nearly 1 percent from 2008. ARRL President Joel Harrison, W5ZN, called it "obvious, contrary to the soap box of the doom and gloom crowd" that interest in Amateur Radio is still in great shape: "2009 was a year where we exceeded our goal of 30,000 new Amateur Radio licensees and the ARRL membership grew right at 1500 members. Even in a year of national economic turmoil, our publication and advertising sales were strong for the year and provided a solid financial result that will allow us to continue to fund a number of initiatives that support and defend the Amateur Radio Service."
